DOING THE RIGHT THING

If we always did the above there would be no need for anyone to write a book on “ethics”, or hold a seminar, or teach a three hour college course; all of which are designed simply to help us understand the necessity of “doing the right thing.” It was in the newspaper a while back. Two pre-teen girls found a purse on the street and returned it to its owner. Obviously they opened it. How else are you to find the name of the person who lost it? They found the name on the driver’s license and credit cards and looked the person up in the phone book to find an address. Along with the usual things found in a ladies purse was the \$4,000 in cash. It had never occurred to them to do any thing other than to return it. When a college professor teaching an ethics class cited this example, one of his female students said she had also found a purse. She discovered the person’s name on her drivers license, found her address, and mailed it back to her. The only difference was that she kept the \$165 in cash that she also found. Her reasoning was perfectly comfortable to her. *“I did her a favor by getting her papers and credit cards back to her,” she said, “and I deserved a reward!”*

Josh and Tara Ferrin, with their two young sons, moved into their first house in Bountiful, Utah. It wasn’t a new home. Within an hour of getting the keys to their new place, the Ferrins had a decision to make. Josh noticed a scrap of carpet sticking out of a small trap door in the garage ceiling. He opened the door and squeezed into the small space where he found several metal boxes. In the boxes were stamps, bond certificates, and cash. The total stash that had been hoarded away in the small space by the recently deceased former owner was worth about \$45,000. Josh and Tara were not wealthy by any means and raising two children in today’s economy was difficult. They certainly could have used the money. Instead, they researched to find the closest relative of the previous home owner. They found his son, and returned the money. His son said, *“My father grew up in hard times and knew the importance of saving. He was a saver, not a spender.”* The only comment Josh and Tara made when asked about their “doing the right thing” was, *“He didn’t save that money for us. He saved it for his family.”* When one of Josh’s friends told him he should have given some of that money to his sons Josh simply said, *“We wanted to give them something more important than money. We wanted to give them a lesson on honesty and integrity.”*

With all the excuses society finds to do otherwise today it is always refreshing to find folks who see the situation for what it really is and not just an opportunity to get their hands on some fast and easy money. Folks who make no room for greed. Folks who “do the right thing.” ***“But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content.” I Tim. 6:6-8 “Better to have a little with godliness, than to be rich and dishonest.” Prov. 16:19***
