LIFE IN ANOTHER WORLD

(The following is a portion of a letter from Larry & Holle Conway in Kenya regarding the work you support)

Hello Everyone:

I wanted to write and give you some of the highlights for the Made In the Streets Ministry of Nairobi, Kenya. In 2011 there were 14 baptisms at the Eastleigh Church and there were 5 baptisms at the Kamulu church. We thank God for the new Christians of 2011. At the Eastleigh church the average attendance is around 40 adults and 10 children.

The Made In the Streets Ministry rescues teenagers who live on the streets of Nairobi. Last month there were 16 teenagers rescued from the streets and taken to begin their new life at Kamulu, just outside of Nairobi city. The children attend an informal school, learn job skills of their choice, experience unconditional love, and are taught about how to become a Christian. In 2011, 20 students began the transition of leaving the program and finding jobs as well as becoming independent. Some of them include Jackline and Mary, who found jobs at a business called Amani ya Juu. Their sewing skills are used to make quilts, toys, and other artwork and crafts. Titus and Duncan are in barber school. John works at a photo shop in Kamulu while George and David are working as apprentices at an auto repair shop.

On Monday the Eastleigh team began the day by praying for the neighborhood, especially for all of the children living on the streets. It rained on Sunday night and we were so happy because the moisture kept the awful dust of the dirt roads to a minimum. We normally have to put up with choking dust as we walk the streets to share the gospel with homeless people in Eastleigh. There are very few paved roads in the community although Eastleigh is a prominent business area of Nairobi. The team always prays before making the visits because the streets are insecure with lots of criminal activity such as theft and drug abuse. Our first visit was to the Lilliput Chum base and we shared the word from John 14. Street kids have been abandoned and feel very vulnerable and alone, so we encouraged them by telling them that Jesus does not want them to feel alone. The next visit was to Lilliput, and we found eight guys and two women at this base. A base is where street people hang out and call their "home." A base may be located at the trash dump, under a tree, at an abandoned building, or just on the road somewhere. Unfortunately, one of the guys was very high from smoking marijuana, and he was really disruptive. However, we asked him to calm down, and he complied to our request and did not disturb us anymore.

We proceeded to the Mlango Kubwa base. It is difficult to visit this base because it is a sad place, full of darkness, and discouraging. There is a woman there who pretends to love the kids on this base, but she actually takes advantage of them by using them to raise money from generous people who are tricked into believing she helps them. We always find kids who are very sick and extremely high from all of the glue they are sniffing. You may wonder why we don't report this woman to the police. The police are very corrupt, unreliable, and many are involved in crimes themselves. We are unable to depend on the police to help the situation. The team has decided to pray for this woman consistently and to love her in spite of her being a drug dealer. The Word of God was shared with her from I John 3:15-17, and we continued to greet all of the children there. **(letter continued on the bulletin board)**
