AS GOD SEES

I'm not sure if it was in a high school literature class or a college one when I first heard that most famous statement of Robert Burns who asked for human folks the ability to "*see ourselves as others see us.*" The famous line is part of a poem the Scottish poet penned after seeing a louse on a lady's hat at church one day. He penned the poem as he mused on the difference it might make if all of us saw ourselves as others did when they watched that tiny bug crawling on the snobbish, upper-class lady at church. Folks sitting behind her in church saw none of her finery, her titles, or her wealth with all its airs on that day. They saw only the louse crawling through all of her finery.

But better than seeing ourselves as others see us would be the ability to see ourselves as God sees us. If we just could we would realize that most of the things we fear never materialize. The majority of the things folks like us tend to worry about will never occur. "*Don't fret about tomorrow,*" Jesus said, "*for each day will bring enough troubles of its own.*" If we could see as God sees we would realize that no problem that arises is without solution; if not here then most certainly in eternity. In gloomy times we wring our hands over questions that seem to have no answers, but the Bible still promises, "*God is faithful, and will not let your trial be more than you can bear. When you are tempted He will show you the way out so that you can stand up under your stress.*" If we could see as God sees we would know that the pain we experience provides for the possibility of growth. "*No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who learn from it,*" the Hebrew writer said. Could it possibly be true that God's peace is greater than our pain, and His promise is greater than our loss? Folks more studied than me seem to think so. The Bible itself leads us to that conclusion. A good end to a painful beginning can seldom be seen in advance. So....in our anxiety, we tend to doubt that anything good could ever come from our heartache. Oh, if we could only "*see as God sees.*" What a great thing that would be.
