NEW OR OLD?

Who doesn't like new stuff? My first car was a 1955 white over brown Plymouth that drove like a Sherman tank. It was anything but new. I'm not driving that car any more. It's probably been melted down and spread out among can openers over time. All the new stuff we buy eventually becomes old, and most of it will be replaced with new stuff yet again. Not always though. I watch Antiques Roadshow because I like it. Some of that old stuff on the show is worth a huge amount more now than when it was new....it's also worth a huge amount more than any new stuff you could buy today to replace it. We sometimes like to mix old and new, don't we? In our house most of the stuff is relatively new, but not all of it. Some of it stretches back to the earliest years of our marriage. Some of it pre-dates even that by quite a lot. New and old quite often blends well together in furnishing a house....but not in all things. There are other places and times when mixing the two simply does not work. Do any of you guys still have an old analog TV and roof antenna? Since the spring of 2009, television stations have been broadcasting exclusively in digital format. The old boxes with roof antennas cannot pick up and process the new signal. They simply are not compatible. Businesses have learned that they must either "keep up" or be hopelessly left behind. New products and new approaches to marketing those products are constantly being developed. If a fella isn't careful he can be left in the dust by the people who are adapting to the new while you are still trying to justify the old. There may still be a few CPA's or scientists that yet use the slide rule, but I'm not personally acquainted with any. None of us would want our children or grandchildren being treated by a doctor who still keeps live leeches on a shelf in his office as a cure for what ails you.

So.....which is best....the new or the old? Both. The teachings of our Lord are more than 2000 years old, but are as fresh and relevant to our generation as they were to Peter's. When Jesus came among us He was rejected because of the new things He taught. But were they really that new? Or was it just that they came from the foundation of principles that had been around for so long we had just forgotten them? Or set them aside because something newer came along that somehow sounded better. It is certainly true that God's Word is eternal and the Scripture cannot be broken. *"Heaven and earth shall pass away, but the Word of the Lord endureth forever,"* is the testimony of the Good Book. Faith and understanding have always been about balance and harmony. The Lord said, *"Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths where is the good way, and walk therein, and ye shall find rest for your souls."* **Jeremiah 6:16** The same Lord also instructed us that *"No one puts new wine into old wineskins for the wine would burst the wineskins, and the wine and the skins would be lost. New wine calls for new wineskins."* **Mark 2:22** The biggest challenge the Jews of Jesus' day faced was setting aside the old covenant for the blessing of the new. The challenge we face in 2012 is taking the old truths of the Gospel and seeing them with new eyes. All of us must be constantly searching both the Scripture and our previous understanding to be sure that we are not missing what God is showing us about very old truth in a very old book. Paul reminded us that *Whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope."* **Rom. 15:4**
