Talking heads are all anxious to sit on a couch with them in front of a camera and ask them how they summoned the courage to do what they did. We appreciate heroes. We respect their humility when they tell the interviewer that they *"just did what any other person would do in the same circumstance."* We give them plaques. We make them famous. We pledge never to forget what they have done.....and then....we do. We simply pass on to the next event and lavish our praise once again. We tend to labor under the illusion that genuine heroics are reserved for an exceptional few....martyrs....saints....but not for average folks like us.

But....what if....just what if the greatest thing we can do is not to go out in a blaze of glory, but to honor God with a life that seeks to do His will in the things that tend to go unnoticed as we search for the truly heroic. Rushing into the fire to save the helpless is indeed heroic. It may cost you your life. Pulling an injured driver from the mangled hulk of a destroyed car risking a pending explosion is indeed heroic. But what if the most heroic thing is something else. How's this for a true challenge for all the would-be heroes among us? Not dying for your faith....most of us will never face that circumstance....but staying true to your faith over the course of a long and difficult lifetime. Being generous with your hard earned money. Listening to and supporting a friend whose life is falling apart. Being "there" for a family that is being drained by long term illness. Or how about this for heroics. Bringing children into this world and sacrificing your life in raising them....praying through your tears when they struggle....investing daily time, energy, and passion as you seek to mold a precious life in a worldly environment that is battling you every step of the way.
