WHINING!

Are you getting a little tired of it? Maybe there's not any more of it in this generation than in previous ones. Maybe it's just the instant access to people on Facebook, through reality shows on TV, or any of the other multi-media outlets that make it seem like an epidemic today. The fella says, "Yeah, I may drink too much sometimes and hit my wife occasionally. Ok, I've slapped my kids around some, but they deserved it. My father used to get drunk and beat me with the buckle end of his belt." The young woman says, "I'm pregnant. He's gone, and I don't know what to do. Life is so unfair!" The twenty year old says, "They're sending me to jail just because I got caught with a little cocaine in my car. Why don't they go after the people that sold it to me?" The wife says, "My husband moved out, and said he never wants to see me again. I told him the affair was over and that the other guy didn't mean anything to me. Why can't he just get over it, and let's get on with our lives?"

And so it goes on...and on...and on. Trash-talk television, celebrity adulteries, drug-busted-yet-still-playing athletes, disappearing moral standards....all have combined to make us think we shouldn't have to be accountable for any of our behaviors. Just who is it that is convincing us that personal behavior and accountability for personal behavior do not go hand-in-hand? Dusty mentioned last Sunday evening the angry outburst from the owner of California Chrome after his horse failed to win the triple crown. By this time most of you have seen and heard it on some news account. Lashing out against the loss. Lashing out against the unfairness. Lashing out at his wife when she tried to rein him in. Blaming others....WHINING.

We chose our actions and our reactions. Much of the time we don't choose our circumstances. We don't choose our parents or our genetic circumstances. We are often confronted with temptations we did not solicit. There are things that are beyond our control...but our actions and reactions regarding those things are always ours to control. And for those we are most certainly accountable. When bad things happen because of bad choices we make accepting accountability is essential. We must be allowed to "suffer the consequences" if bad behavior is ever to be corrected. I say all of that to say this. As Christians we sometimes think it's our job to fix everything. It's not. If a fella makes a mess, it's his mess, not yours. He has to clean it up if things are ever going to get better. We are not to make excuses for the rotten behavior of others, nor allow them to whine, blame, or manipulate us into "fixing" the situation for them. What are we to do? We are to be loving...kind...compassionate...forgiving...and supportive of their efforts to straighten out their lives. We are to recognize that there is a difference in being genuinely helpful and making a bad situation worse by supporting a lack of accountability. As Christians, we care about people. We try to follow God's instruction to "love our neighbor as ourselves." Sometimes that love must be "tough." We must hold others accountable because God does...and He always has. Speaking of the judgment of God Paul wrote "who will render to every man according to his deeds." **Romans 2:6** "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad."

II Corinthians 5:10 Being held accountable may not be easy...but it is always right.
