LEADERSHIP...????

Just what does that mean...this business of being a leader? There are a lot of different ideas out there and a lot of "leadership styles" to pick from. Have you ever seen a leadership position ruin someone? When they were your co-worker they worked hard to help those about them accomplish the common goals of the job. You liked them...got along well with them. But then that promotion came along, and things changed. He or she became that "boss" who seemed to think his/her number one job was to be "bossy." For some reason or other becoming a leader can mess with the minds of some folks. It just goes to their head. Their cap size doubles overnight. Some folks work hard to be promoted to a leadership position, and when they get it seem to think the title gives them sovereign right to rule over their little kingdom like a tyrant. Do you lead at work? Do you lead in your family? Do you lead here at Dayton? Let's be sure we understand we have been blessed with a position of leadership for the sake of others...not for our own sake.

Joseph was elevated to a position so high in Egypt that he was second only to Pharaoh himself. He understood that he held that position to make life better for Egyptians. So he prepared them for seven years of famine. He understood that his lofty position was provided to him by God so that he could ultimately save his own family....thereby preserving the blood line for the Savior to come. His position of leadership was for the sake of serving others...not for bragging rights. Moses wasn't adopted into the family of Pharaoh just to live a life of luxury. He was there to learn the ways of Egypt so that he could ultimately lead a nation of millions out of bondage. He was given leadership for the sake of others...not for his own sake. Look at Peter, James, John, and the other apostles. What did these guys die from? Not cancer, was it? They died for the preaching of the Gospel. They died so that others might be saved. And just what did Jesus say regarding Himself? "The Son of man came not to be served, but to serve others and to give His life a ransom for others." **Matt. 28:20**

I certainly understand that leadership, especially in business, must at times involve the element of discipline for those working under us who are unwilling to fulfill their job requirements. But even in this, leaders must do what they do in discipline to make the work environment what it must be for others. Where did we go wrong? Where do some preachers get the idea that leadership in the Church is all about "pay and perks." Contracts are negotiated with the eye always on the bottom line of how am I to be personally benefitted. Just who convinced us that leadership is more about "bossing people" than it is serving them. Diotrephes was an early church leader during John's day. He exercised the leadership style of a tyrant. He, and he alone, decided who remained in the Church. If they didn't toe his line he simply "cast them out." John said one of the many sins involved in his leadership was that he "loved to have the preeminence." **III John 9-10** Whatever the leadership capacity in which you serve, your leadership "style" should serve to guide rather than to exploit...to teach rather than to intimidate...to protect rather than to mistreat. Here at Dayton as citizens of the Kingdom of God we live for the sake of serving God's calling on our lives. All of us are leaders in some capacity. May we always exercise that leadership to benefit others...not self. Larry B.
