INTEGRITY

It's an old word. As old as Job in your Bible...and even older than him. I wonder what happened to it. It's a good word, isn't it? It has a good definition and an even better reputation. It used to be highly valued. Still is, I suppose, with an ever-diminishing few. I can remember when we used to think that the very first duty of any leader was to be a person of integrity....whether that leadership was in politics, athletics, business, education, family, or church. Our values have somehow shifted over the years. What matters the most now seems to be a person's title, fame, or income. Too many folks think those things can substitute for integrity....for character. Where did we get an idea like that? We've somehow come to the place in our society where we have been willing to overlook a person's out-of-control lifestyle so long as he can still score points that will allow our team to win. We have become tolerant of flagrant excess and infidelity so long as money can be made or ego can be stroked. We have put up with everything from perjury and kickbacks in our public officials to abusive language and unfair treatment by owners and bosses. We do that while telling ourselves "*someone's personal life has nothing to do with his competence for a public role.*" And we somehow say that with straight faces. Are we crazy? Just who convinced us that such nonsense was true?

Listen folks, character, honesty, and integrity are basic to trustworthy people and trust should not be given without those virtues. People who are deceitful in one area of their lives will not hesitate to be deceitful in any other if it gets them what they want. Do you remember what our mama's tried to teach us when we were little? Play nice....tell the truth....don't take things that don't belong to you....treat others the way you want them to treat you. People who lack integrity that rise to fortune or stardom will ultimately be exposed when their character is tested. But here's the strange thing. We seem to be willing to vote them back in office, buy their music, invest in their schemes, pay to see them play, and otherwise support them in their public roles. We tell ourselves that we just don't see the connection between their private life and public life. We don't think who they are as people has anything to do with who they are as professionals. Sixty successful CEO's of major corporations were studied. Here's an interesting thing that was found in the study. Almost all of them were still married to their first spouse. People who value commitments and promises value them at every level. If they live them at home they will live them at work.

What is true for those who make headlines is true for us as well. We are Christians. The world has a right to expect us to be different....to demand that we be different. We are to live honest, open, good, and godly lives. What we represent ourselves to be when we come to the assemblies here at Dayton we must indeed be when we leave here to go out there. We have no games to play. We're not trying to fool anybody. What we preach is what we believe. And what we believe is at the foundation of the way we live our lives whether in public or private. We are Christians. And because we are we are people of integrity. Watch out for this world. If it has it's way integrity will be a thing of the past. Solomon said a long time ago, "*Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but whoever follows perverse ways will be found out.*" **Proverbs 10:9**
